Additional Charles Bird References

22 December 1844 – Sunday – The 13th, 14th, and 15th quorums of Seventy were organized in Nauvoo, with **Charles Bird**, Jonathan Durham and John Lytle as senior presidents. Source: Jenson, Andrew, *Church Chronology*.

The following references all took place at Winter Quarters in the fall, early winter of 1846, the year the Saints migrated from Nauvoo:

25 August 1846 – Bro. C. Kennedy said the Omaha's had returned from their hunt, that Bros. A.P. Rockweed, J.M. Grand and **Charles Bird** had seen them; they were friendly and wanted a council, and Thursday had been proposed as the time.

30 August 1846 – At seven p.m., the council of the Twelve and High council assembled at Captain Rockwood's tent. The council voted that Elders Orson Pratt, Jedediah M. Grant and **Charles Bird** be appointed to a committee to visit the Omaha's and Ottoe's on the following Tuesday. The council resolved themselves into a committee to visit the country.

18 November 1846 – Bishop Newel K. Whitney, Albert P. Rockweed, William Clayton, Cornelius P. Lott and John Scott were appointed to ascertain the situation and condition of the Church property in camp. Bro. Lorenzo D. Young was honorably discharged from the sheep committee at his own request. A committee was appointed to labor and advise with the stray herd committee that the animals might be better taken care of; and **Charles Bird** was instructed to crib the corn purchased on the other side of the river. It was agreed that all the animals running at large between sunrise and sunset should be treated as strays. Source: *Journal of History*.
